Due to the coronavirus pandemic, Board Members will attend the meeting via remote access for the purpose of considering a project for which financial assistance is being sought from the Illinois Department of Transportation pursuant to its Capital Grants Program.

## The project is generally described as follows:

- A. Project Description: Bus Transfer Center in Downtown Bloomington. The new Connect Transit Downtown Transfer Station is planned to be located within or adjacent to the Downtown Bloomington area called "The Buckle". "The Buckle" is a geographic area defined by four roads and/or State routes. These roads include the north/south State Route Business 51 (N. Madison St. & N. East St.) and the east/west Route 9 (E. Locust St.) and E. Olive St., respectively. This area houses many local amenities including but not limited to the following: Local Businesses and Dining, Farmer's Market, Performing Arts Center, Arena, Corporate Office, and Local Government. Additionally, the Transfer Station is planned to occupy approximately one to two city blocks within the defined area while being flanked by all the Downtown area has to offer.
- B. Relocation: Relocation Assistance will not be required.
- C. Environment: This project is being implemented to minimize environmental impacts.
- D. Comprehensive Planning: This project is in conformance with comprehensive transportation planning in the area.
- E. Elderly and Handicapped: All new facilities included in this project will be accessible to the elderly and handicapped.
